Proud Families


Tune-in to Channel 7 to see our adoptive families share their heartfelt stories!

Karen Meyers from ABC 7 News came to GiGi's Playhouse to interview three families, each of whom have adopted a child with Down syndrome. The differences amongst the families were obvious--a single mother, first time parents, and parents of seven children. But the common thread they each shared was stronger than any difference--their love for a child with Down syndrome. As they spoke about their decisions to adopt, their smiles gave away the joy they have come to know through their child. While each had their own reasons for the unconventional choice of special needs adoption, their outlook was the same. In response to Karen's question about the challenges of raising a child with Down syndrome, one proud father responded, "I struggle to get her coat on in the morning. 
2 p.m. We have pizza, volunteers and fun for all! Siblings and friends are welcome!!!

Open Play-Every Thursday! Everyone is welcome! Stop by for pizza, pop and fun! We have volunteers to assist with the kids so the parents can hang out! It is awesome!!!!

The literacy program- GiGi's Playhouse provides FREE private tutoring to children with Down syndrome. Customized materials are provided for each individual student. The program also assists teachers and parents on how to tutor their children.

"Future" Friday Friends— Ages 6-8 only. Kids create lasting friendships through facilitated interactive play, while promoting good social skills. Each session ends with a pizza dinner in which social skills and table manners will be encouraged.

Friday Friends- Ages 18 and up only. Party with the gang! Equal numbers of peers with Down syndrome as without. Karaoke, dances, laser tag, bowling, prom, movie nights, friends and fun!

2 and under group – Families with kids 2 and under get together to play, and have fun while the parents network with each other!

Hop, Skip and Jumpers– For 3-5 year olds, this program will help promote friendships, good social

skills and interactive play through fun creative activities! **Hispanic Group**- Spanish speaking families gather for food, fun, friendship and education.

Polish Play Group– Polish speaking families gather for an afternoon of fun and friendship.

Reserved– Playhouse may be reserved for private play groups, parties or support groups

GiGi's Crawlers: This group focuses on crawling skills as well as fine motor skills, social interaction with peers in a semi-structured environment. Children need to be crawling and are accompanied by a parent/adult.

GiGi's Walkers: This group focuses on post walking skills with peers to prepar children for school activities (balance beam, kicking, throwing, jumping, etc.) Children need to be walking and must be accompanied by a parent/adult.

The Playhouse can be reserved for any Down syndrome related event.

When it is available it may also be used by other groups with special needs.



2 & under playgroup: Families with children 2 and under get together and play while the parents network with each other. Siblings always welcome.

3-4 year old playgroup: Families with children ages 3-4 get together and play while the parents network with each other. Siblings always welcome.

Pre-crawlers/Crawlers: This group focuses on crawling skills as well as fine motor skills, social interaction with peers in a semi-structured environment. Pre-crawlers is for children who are just starting to crawl and the Crawlers is for children who are crawling on all fours. Children must be accompanied by a parent/adult.

Pre-walkers/Walkers: This group focuses on post walking skills with peers to prepare children for school activities (balance beam, kicking, throwing, jumping, etc.) The pre-walkers is for children who are just starting to walk

independently and the Walkers group is for children who are walking independently. Children must be accompanied by a parent/adult.

Teen Tastic: This group meets from 7-9 pm. We order pizza for dinner and have lots of fun watching movies and playing games with each other. 6th-12th grades.

Hispanic Group: Spanish speaking families gather for food, fun, friendship and education.


Come Sign with Us: Come with or without your children to learn basic sign language skills. New words introduced each session.

These books, of all levels and topics, will be given to the children and adults in our literacy program. Our volunteers come from a variety of backgrounds—parents of children with Down syndrome, students, people from Assurance Agency, and friends of the Playhouse. Together they folded, laminated, stapled, bound and cut for two hours! Through their efforts, our tutors will be able to provide the appropriate books for each child during their tutoring session. The literacy program has over 100 individuals with Down syndrome enrolled and more on our waiting lists. Our Literacy Night will be the last Wednesday of each month at the Hoffman location from 6:30

to 8:30pm. Due to Spring Break in March, our next Literacy Night will be April 25th.
