We were lucky that the first messages we heard were of love and support and congratulations, unlike so many of the stories I have heard and read. Within a couple of hours, the genetic specialist was in my room telling me about all the things that you would be able to do. Yes, I

did grieve, and still struggle with moments of great sadness, but more for the cruelty, both overt and subtle, that you will experience in the world, than for any loss on our part. The subtle mes-



sage of "less than" is so palpable these days, and so hard to hear, especially given the richness you have brought into our lives. But sitting in the NICU for the week you were there slammed things into perspective pretty quickly. You were here, you were healthy, and, unlike some of the other little ones, you would be coming home



nosis dancing over and over in my head. To appreciate your smiles and giggles without measuring them against a timetable. To hold you without focusing on what developmental steps might be difficult for you. To just play with you without

thinking about whether I was stimulating your neurological development enough. Your sister has been a good teacher in that. Watching her push your stroller at breakneck speed down a grocery aisle — just to see if you will giggle again serves as a great re-minder of what is really important.

The challenge was to learn what the diagnosis meant for you. You have low muscle tone, so it will take longer for you to be physically able to negotiate physical challenge. You will take longer to learn things, but you will learn. You will learn to read, but in a different

way. Every day, I learn more.

The Westmont Literacy Program was presented a check from Thrivent Financial along with a blessing for the program, tutors, and families. The Church graciously nominated our fundraiser last July for this matching grant and helped process the paperwork. The fundraiser at The Grape restaurant raised \$2,647.70. 
