Michael: A Total Blessing DOWN SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH

Now Serving 4 Locations

My doctors suspected our baby had Down syndrome when I took the prenatal blood test. When we walked out of the office that day, I felt like the world had just ended for me. I was completely distraught, angry at God, asking questions like, "how could this

happen to me, why me?" I was very emotional and very scared about the future and the future of the baby.

We walked out of the office with books and paperwork so we could make the decision whether or not to keep the baby. The paperwork directed us where and how to get

an abortion. We went home to discuss our options. We did a lot of talking to each other and to God. Our talking often broke down into fighting. On the day I was to call the hospital and give them our decision, I cried and cried. That was the day Nancy called me.

The geneticist had warned me,

"Don't believe what parents of children with Down syndrome say. Parents paint a rosy picture, you can't believe them." Nancy broke down the wall constructed by the geneticist when she provided a balanced perspective of life with a child with Down syndrome. She told

> me about her daughter and her struggles. She never said raising a child with Down syndrome is easy but it is rewarding. I had to trust that God was going to take care of my baby and my family. That day, I called my doctor and told him that I was not going to have an abortion. This

was the first time since the first blood test that I had a spark of hope that this was not going to be as bleak as what all the professionals wanted me to believe. I knew there would be obstacles and challenges but we are going to be ok.

It took me about three weeks to

muster up that courage GiGi's Playhouse and just look around. They were having Open Play that day and I was able to watch parents interacting with their kids; moms with their babies. I remember thinking they were so happy. They seemed so at peace. I remember a baby only a couple of months old with his siblings loving on him. Everyone in the family was so happy! It definitely was not how I thought life with a baby with Down syndrome would be.

I want other expectant moms to see what it is like to have a child with Down syndrome before they make any decisions. I can't express the hope I felt after seeing other mothers with their children with Down syndrome. How I felt that if they can do it, I can do it too. Before visiting GiGi's I felt so alone. Seeing other mothers and their families loving, and embracing them, gave me the strength and hope and eventually joy to have my own.

If I could, what would I change about Michael? Absolutely nothing.

This has been a busy month for GiGi's Playhouse! In July, our friend Karen Meyer from Channel 7 came to the Chicago Playhouse to see the new

location! She was so impressed with the growth of the Playhouse and said



"This is the fastest growing non-profit in the Chicagoland area!"

Then after Governor Palin's speech, Channel 2 came to the Hoffman Estates Playhouse to interview parents on their feelings about having an advocate in office. I called the main number, offered my help and

began telling everyone who would listen all about the new DS awareness center that was coming. Rebecca and I came by to offer our help and see what GiGi's was really about. What was there for her at age 5? How could she fit in? Well, I couldn't have been more pleased with everything we have

encountered. Rebecca feels right at home. She knows where the toys, books and games are kept, where the potty is, and even tries to sing with the karaoke machine! The most unbelievable thing that has happened since we've become involved has been the

Literacy Program. Rebecca LOVES the books! She drags her full bag of books and plops them down in front of us at all hours of the day. None of us can resist when she wants to learn! She even nabbed a few of her sibling's friends to help (which they quickly learned how to comply.) You can see the pride Rebecca feels when she gets her

words right. We have noticed a huge jump in her verbal skills, in particular in combining two to five word sentences. How the rest of the family has benefited from GiGi's Playhouse is that we KNOW Rebecca will always be accepted for who she is and no one will try to change her.





My mom, who drives Veronica to "camp" everyday, came home one afternoon quite upset as to what another student said about Veronica. A little girl came up to my mom and said "My mommy says that Veronica

has no brain?" Long story short, this child's mother, who is a psychologist, explained to her daughter that those who have Down syndrome don't have a working brain and are stupid. After my anger subsided (and I used every bad word in the diction-

ary), I drew on my strength that I get from Veronica and from the strength I get from the Playhouse and I realized I need to explain to both this child AND her mother even though she wears her diagnosis on her face and may look different from other children she is the same in so many ways. I have been so focused on bringing awareness about Down syndrome to her peers I guess I forgot I need to bring this fact to the parents of these children as well! Needless to say I came armed to school with brochures about the Playhouse and with Activity Booklets. While I feel so much has been accomplished in the less than 5 years the Playhouse has
