Brianna — A Gift

When Brianna was brought into the NICU, a doctor whom I had never spoken to before told me

he believed she had Down syndrome. I was shell-shocked. There were some hard times recalibrating our hopes, dreams and expectations for Brianna.

The breakthrough for me came when one social worker shared with me

the GiGi's calendar. It was filled with children with Down syndrome dreaming to be dancers, princesses, firemen, businessmen, and football players. There were inspirational quotes from parents as well. But it was the pictures that captured my heart. These

children in the calendar were having dreams met; they were leading a fulfilling childhood. There

> was true joy in their smiles, joy that cannot be faked for a camera, but that came from their hearts.

At that moment, I realized I needed to take off the lenses I had been looking through, the lenses of disability, the lenses that saw a child

with Down syndrome as a normal child minus some set of abilities and capabilities. I needed to put on a different set of lenses and see Brianna as a child with abilities. She was a gift that was additive to our lives and the world.

Her life should be judged by

something more fundamentally important. Would she have a rich and meaningful life? Would her life bring joy and fulfillment to herself and those who love her? Our job as parents was not to create barriers and say what she could not do. We needed to knock down barriers for her and be her advocate, helping her achieve that fulfilling and meaningful life she deserves.

Today, now that the heart surgery is over, we focus much more on Brianna than on Down syndrome or her medical complications. We are really enjoying our daughter as a gift and trying to afford her all of the opportunities to grow and blossom to her potential. We recognize that there are plenty of difficult times and perhaps even some more heart break ahead, but I think that is what you sign up for, generally, when you decide to become a parent. The joys and successes of becoming a parent are not free, but they outweigh the trials and tribulations of parenthood.

As for my advice for new parents, I would recommend the following:

Plug into a support network of positive people — they will be a key to helping you "get over the hump" and keeping you in the right frame of mind to make your tomorrows as valuable as possible. Look to friends, family,

coworkers, and support groups and organizations.

• For those people around you who are either not positive or are not "appropriate", help them learn and reframe their thinking. You will be making your world, and the world at large, a better place.

- Take some time to mourn, but recognize you are mourning your dreams, not your child's.
- Take off the lens of disability and put on the lens of abilities. Then help others to do the same. Your child is a gift that will bring joy and fulfillment to your life. She is additive to the value of your life, not subtractive.

Anna has been a part of our Literacy Program for about 6 months. She is 5 years old and completely awesome. I love being her tutor. She works so hard every session and we have such a good time! We have been working with various books and flashcards and last week I made some winter/Christ-

mas flashcards to work with. At the beginning of the program, she would find the correct word to match to the flashcard out of a field of two. Now. she picks out of a field of 4 or 5! Her mom, Jill, tells me that she spreads all her words out on the floor at home and plays the matching game by herself, picking out the words out of a big pile!

2 & Under Playgroup • Families with children 2 and under get together and play while the parents network with each other. Siblings always welcome.

Crawlers This group focuses on crawling skills as well as fine motor skills, social interaction with peers in a semi-structured environment.

Walkers This group focuses on post walking skills with peers to prepare children for school activities (balance beam, kicking, throwing, jumping, etc.).

Hop, Skip & Jumpers ◆ This program helps promote friendships, social skills, and interactive play through fun creative activities! For preschool and kindergartners (3-5yr olds).

Playhouse Pals ◆ This structured playgroup focuses on developing friendships and confidence all while having a great time! 1st -3rd grades (6-8yr olds).

Kids Club This fast paced group incorporates social, communication and confidencebuilding skills and activities! 4th-8th grades (9-12 yr olds)

Teen-Tastic ◆ What a party! We order pizza for dinner and have lots of fun watching movies and playing games with each other. 9th-12th grades (13-17 year olds).


The December group had lots of fun dancing to Christmas tunes, creating a snowman picture frame, and listening to how snowmen celebrate the holi-

What GiGi's Playhouse Means to the Delaney Family

My introduction to GiGi's Playhouse seemed to be one of divine intervention. When my second son was born (Jack, Dec. 10th, 2007), my husband and I were completely unprepared for the revelation that he had Down syndrome. My lactation nurse recommended that I seek out support from GiGi's Playhouse. I asked her if she could arrange someone to come to my home to meet with me. 5 days after I gave birth, the day after I re-turned home with my precious baby,

Heidi Aldama came to my home. I can still feel the emotion as she entered our home. I just wanted to hug and cry on the shoulder of another mother who has experienced all the emotions I was going through. Now, for my husband, this was a bit overwhelming... but for me, it was cathartic and necessary for me to be able to move forward. Ever



since that day I have never looked back. I have attended seminars provided by GiGi's that has given me great insight regarding Early Intervention and various therapies. My husband and son, Charlie (3), come to the crawlers and 2's and Under group. When Jack turned one this year a girlfriend called me to wish him a happy birthday. She asked me if the day

brought back any of those feelings I experience on the day of his birth. The answer is simple... my love for Jack is so strong that it has washed away all my initial feelings of fear, anger, doubt, and pain. I am a lifetime of a different person than the day he was born. GiGi's Playhouse was my refuge where I could find a common bond and connection with other parents. I am so excited about our future with the Playhouse and the great friendships we will make.
