## Welcome to GiGi's Playhouse Quad Cities!

On behalf of the Quad Cities Board of Directors, we are proud to be the 8th member of the GiGi's Playhouse family. Most of us on the Board have children using the services and programs provided by GiGi's. GiGi's Playhouse is truly a passion for us! We worked hard after signing our Operating Agreement in July 2011 to renovate our storefront to a GiGi's Playhouse by October 1st, 2011.

That is not to say we are doing this alone. Other GiGi's Playhouses, especially the National Office at Hoffman Estates, have given us countless hours of support in the form of advice, programming materials, free legal service and software programs to name a few. We have received tremendous support from the Quad Cities community as well. There are numerous examples of how we have been embraced by our local community. At our *Walking on the UpSide of Down Syndrome* on October 1st, we had over 1000 participants, raising over \$25,000. On that same day, the Chamber of Commerce and the mayor of East Moline (one of

Most importantly, I am proud to say we have started programs for all ages from children 2 & under all the way up to adult with Friday Friends. These programs for every age group are being held at a minimum of once per month. But, we are just getting started! We have big plans for next year starting with Literacy programming in January. So stay tuned!




## A Heartfelt Thanks....
