#### The important Things in Life

Imagine a breezy, March afternoon going to the doctor office and hearing your child has a 1/30 chance of having Down syndrome. How do you react, right? That's what I thought when I heard the news our third child, Devon would have Down syndrome. I cried for about 5 minutes and then thought, ok, God has a plan, but I wasn't sure what it was! After leaving the appointment, we attempted to educate ourselves, our children, family members, and friends. I hopped on the internet right away to educate myself and passed along any information that I had read. I had learned of the

early childhood interventions that our Area Education Agency had for families. I accessed them as soon as Devon was born. I called Marlene, July 29th, 3 days after Devon was born and said it's time to get started. I was very much a person who was going to advocate for my son and really didn't want to wait. My husband was very supportive of this new role and was

ready for whatever needed to be done. A small group of families came together and began a local parent group known as, "Buddies for Life." This was our local Down syndrome support group that was started to advocate for children and adults in the tri-state area (lowa, South Dakota, and Nebraska). I had heard of GiGi's Playhouse from a friend and began to bring this idea to the group and said, "We really need one here! It is a great place to begin supporting the educational needs of our families and a place where all our kids can play and engage with other siblings." Today, I am proud to say GiGi's has helped Devon in reading, following directions, and listening. His kindergarten teacher and Resource teacher were very surprised at what Devon knew in coming to Kindergarten. He

is reading at a level A in guided reading, knows his numbers and all of the letters of the alphabet! Thank you to his tutors at GiGi's for the extra support! In Devon's spare time, he has played t-ball with his classmates, participates in TaeKwonDo (and is a green stripe) and cheers for the Nebraska Cornhuskers. Devon is a true joy to our lives and we have learned more from him than what he will ever learn from us!
