Group Tutoring Makes Students 'Hungry' For Literacy

What began as an experiment to get ready for school has turned into a wild success. Our Group Literacy Tutoring classes brought together parents, students and teachers for some back-to-school readiness, using Eric Carle's The Very Hungry Caterpillar as a basis to mix math and reading skills.

Each week, the classes used the book as a jumping off point to translate the words in the books into real-world experiences to reinforce learning. As they began, students acted like the titular caterpillar eating through one apple, two pears, three plums, etc. The tutors used our chalkboards and other materials to name the foods and the numbers, providing students with even more visual cues.

In addition to teaching reading and pre-math skills, the group literacy setting served as a reminder of how things work in a classroom setting: teaching kids to take turns and focusing on the teacher during learning time, which should provide an easier transition for kids adjusting from the relative freedom of summer back into the classroom setting.

We owe a big "Thank you" to many people for taking the initiative and making this program a huge success, not the least of whom is our tireless literacy coordinator Debbie Hanrahan. In addi-

tion, veteran literacy tutors Amanda Hillmann and Stephanie Ganacopolus, helped put the program together. And we owe another huge thanks to tutors Maxie Lane, Danielle Dano, Dan Lorden, Xenia Basarab and Anna Calif.
