Debuting this Sunday October 18th at the annual "GiGiFest" Family Fest in Hoffman Estates, the branded trailer will be hauled by a one-of-a-kind tractor truck, also owned by NRS, which was specifically designed to raise awareness for individuals with Down syndrome. The debut also coincides with Down Syndrome Awareness Month which GiGi's Playhouse and its families & supporters refer to as Down Syndrome ACCEPTANCE MONTH. NRS anticipates that the trailer could be driven as much as 500-1,000 miles per week for GiGi's events, campaigns and other company projects. GiGiFest hosts 1,000 guests including families, volunteers, donors, and more.
