

All the Colors Activities

Our homes are simply filled with colors--Look for ways to match colors and identify colors throughout your normal daily routines. Here are just a few ideas:

Sorting Colors: Separate a bunch of plastic eggs, have your child match like colors, sort a handful of fruit loops (or legos).

I Spy Scavenger Hunt: Have your child hunt for objects in the chosen color. To make it a bit easier, give your child a piece of paper in the desired color so they can match it.

Have bubble wrap and paint? Total disclosure- I saw this on Pinterest. On plastic sheeting or other surface that won't be damaged by paint, place paint in small puddles, cover with a piece of bubble wrap and tape the edges down securely. Your child can spread the paint with their hands or feet and mix/spread the paint all they want with NO MESS!

Balls and Ballons Most of us have different sizes and colors of balls (balloons are great too and less likely to break anything). Before throwing the ball to your child, ask "red or blue" or "kick the yellow ball, throw the green ball, roll the purple ball".
