Making a difference Recently when a new Mom came to

the Playhouse we asked how she heard about us and she said "From EVERYONE - starting with the hospitals, to my neighbors and friends." Together we can all make a difference! Here is one nurse's story:

There are not too many times when you can be sure that you touched someone's life and made it better. As an RN in the Neo-natal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), I am often

surrounded by concerned and overwhelmed parents. Recently, I was given the opportunity to care for a newborn baby girl with Down syndrome, Sarah. When caring for a new baby, you are also caring for the family. Sarah was two days old when I first began caring for her. I called her mother and asked her if she would like to come and feed Sarah. When mom came to the NICU, she was obviously overwhelmed with all of the information being given to her about her new baby. I asked her if she had been told about GiGi's Playhouse. She said that she was given some handouts and websites to look over but had never heard of GiGi's. I gave her the Celebration Packet that we keep on hand at the NICU for moments like these. The next day, when Sarah's mom came to the NICU, she was smiling and thanked me for giving her the information about GiGi's. She said that the Playhouse seemed like it would be a great place for her family in the future.

This is just one example of the many times I have been able to present new parents with positive information about their newborn with Down syndrome. The relief I see on the faces of the new moms and dads is amazing. Their whole disposition changes when they hear 'congratulations' and receive the GiGi's Celebration packet. So thank you, GiGi's, for supplying us with these Celebration packets to give to our new parents. It changes their whole outlook and quite possibly, the lives of them and their new baby. — Christine Pykett, RN

New Baby Signs Class!!! Research has shown that the use of sign language with children at an early age will jump start speech and language development. We are very excited to offer a 3 week introductory Baby Sign Class. The Class will be taught by Liz Gordon, M.S. Independent Certified Instructor. Each week will have a new theme: Mealtime, Bedtime, Bath Time, etc. The stimulating activities, songs, play, and information introduced will all support learning and signs. It will be held on 3 consecutive Wednesday mornings at 9am; July 11th, 18th, and 25th. You must be able to commit to all classes in order to enroll. Class is 45 minutes long and targeted for kids ages 6-30 months. Class is limited to 8 children and may be offered again in the fall. Take home materials will be provided. Call the Playhouse to register.

Crawlers Class has an opening

We have space for 2 more kids in the Crawlers class. Cathy our PT, with help from Sue our volunteer give great individual

GiGi's Playhouse is run on the heart and soul of our dedicated volunteers (and sponsors!). We have well over 200 volunteers that offer their time and energy to ensuring that the Playhouse activities are running smoothly. Each of our 8 monthly weekend programs are hosted by volunteers and parents. Our literacy program is run by volunteer tutors. Not only are these scheduled programs run by volunteers, so are all of our events and Playhouse tasks! Without the consistency and passion that each of you special volunteers bring to GiGi's, we wouldn't be what we are today!





Open Play: Every Thursday! Everyone is welcome! Stop by for pizza, pop and fun! We have volunteers to assist with the kids so the parents can hang out! It's awesome!

Literacy Program: GiGi's Playhouse provides FREE private tutoring to children with Down syndrome. Customized materials are provided for each individual student. The program also assists teachers and parents on how to tutor their children.

"Future" Friday Friends: Ages 6-8 only. Kids create lasting friendships through facilitated interactive play, while promoting good social skills. Each session ends with a pizza dinner in which social skills and table manners will be encouraged.

Friday Friends: Ages 18 and up only. Party with the gang! Equal numbers of peers with Down syndrome as without. Karaoke, dances, laser tag, bowling, prom, movie nights, friends and fun!

2 and under group: Families with kids 2 and under get together to play, and have fun while the parents network with each other!

Hop, Skip and Jumpers: For 3-5 year olds, this program will help

promote friendships, good social skills and interactive play through fun creative activities

Hispanic Group: Spanish speaking families gather for food, fun, friendship and education.

Polish Play Group: Polish speaking families gather for an afternoon of fun and friendship.

Reserved: Playhouse may be reserved for private play groups, parties or support groups

GiGi's Crawlers: This group focuses on crawling skills as well as fine motor skills, social interaction with peers in a semi-structured environment. Children need to be crawling and are accompanied by a parent/ adult

GiGi's Walkers: This group focuses on post walking skills with peers to prepar children for school activities (balance beam, kicking, throwing, jumping, etc.) Children need to be walking and must be accompanied by a parent/adult.

The Playhouse can be reserved for any Down syndrome related event

When it is available it may also be used by other groups with special needs.


and helped keep track of the kids. Each child went home with a prize! The evening was capped off with a rousing round of bubbles from our bubble machine!


