class, I braced myself for the questions they would ask. "Why does she have a green shirt on in every one of those pictures?" Lora had taken all of the pictures on one day and that is what the kids focused on. In other years, the questions were things like, "Does Sarah like to go to the zoo?" or "How can Sarah do the monkey bars so fast?". Now that the kids are older, a recent question was "will she always have Down syndrome?" As the kids get older and the questions get harder, Lora still feels that Sarah will be part of the class and feels that providing an open forum to ask questions is what has helped Sarah fit in. Sarah is active in Kids Club and the Literacy program at GiGi's and Lora is the accountant for the Playhouse. 

will help fund our programs.


