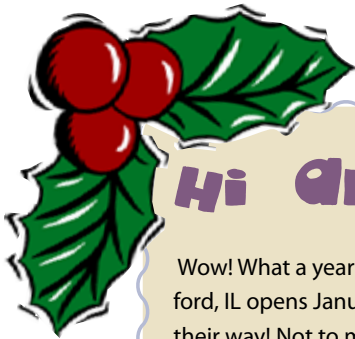

Wow! What a year! 4 new locations! Des Moines, Iowa opened, Rockford, IL opens January 8th and New York and Atlanta are set up and on their way! Not to mention all that has been going on at our existing Playhouses! We launched our long awaited math program, condensed our literacy and phonics program into one amazing program, enhanced our hospital outreach to reach the Spanish population, added Club GiGi's for our adult population, started a theatre groups for teens, dance class for tots and many other programs to raise self esteem and get some therapy to boot!

In order to manage all of these locations we needed a server based model and standardized policies, procedures and materials – all of which are paramount in our growth. That was a bigger job than I ever thought but will be worth it to support all the efforts of each Playhouse! Here is a letter I recently wrote to all of the GiGi's Playhouse board members;

Yesterday was one of those days when I woke up in a panic. Are we doing enough for Down syndrome? How can we help the Playhouses more? How are we going to get more money? It was the kind of panic that made your heart pound and you knew you were not going back to sleep.

I started shooting out emails and I realized that I needed to take a step back and look at all that HAS been accomplished. WOW! Because of all of YOU, we truly are changing the way people see Down syndrome! I am not just talking here in our own communities but all around the world! When I got to the Playhouse I received an email from our new board in Mexico! Yes, Mexico! We just got our national model down and now we are talking with our lawyers for creating an international model! Then GiGi's Mexico will be born!

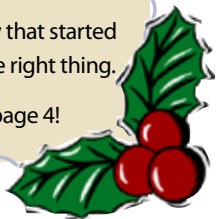
After I read the email, I went to the front of the Hoffman Playhouse and there was a Hispanic child being tutored. Excited, I told the mother that we are opening a Playhouse in Mexico! She was thrilled and said "I know you don't remember me, but 3 years ago when I first came here, you told me my daughter can do anything! No one believed that in my family. You told me to potty train and not to give up! My family said 'No, leave her alone'. But I listened to you and I went home and in 8 days (very hard days) she was potty trained! Thank you! Thank you for GiGi's Playhouse!" She was right, I did not remember. But because there was a place for her to come, to learn to believe in her child, to see the potential in her child, she raised the bar. Watching that little kindergarten girl walk out of the Playhouse, with 4 new literacy books in hand, was what I needed to motivate me and keep us on our mission.

I know that talking to that mother was my sign from God to keep moving forward. A day that started with so much question and uncertainty ended with love, pride, hope and the certainty that yes, we are doing the right thing.

At GiGi's, the programs that we provide are based on the needs of all individuals with Down syndrome and their families. However, the impact goes much farther than those receiving direct services. It's about so much more than the learner with Down syndrome...take Hanna for example...



The GiGi's LifeCycle

- It's about Hanna's parents going to *GiGi's Open Play* when she was first born and hearing CONGRATULATIONS! You just had a baby! And them realizing that Hanna is just that - their baby daughter!
- It's about taking that realization, and working hard with Hannah in the *GiGi's Crawlers and Walkers* programs to combat the low muscle tone that is so common to children with Down syndrome.
- It's about Hanna going to Kindergarten with the ability to read from *GiGi's Literacy Program* and changing the way her teacher views Down syndrome.
- It's about Hanna going to Junior High with the self confidence she gained at the *GiGi's Open Mic and Teen Nights*. Being confident in who she is helps her develop friendships.
- It's about Hannah graduating High school and showing the world that they can't put limitations on her.
- It's about Hannah using the skills she learned in the *Literacy, Phonics and Math Programs* to find a job that she enjoys and can excel at.
- It's about Hannah using the *Life Skills* classes at GiGi's to live independently in her own apartment because she has budgeting, reading and social skills.

Making a Difference

Pam, a student at Elmhurst college, volunteers every week at GiGi's Playhouse. Here, she describes why, "When I heard Nancy speak at my school, I knew that was a good place for me to volunteer. I started volunteering every other week administratively. I helped with thank you notes, *i have a voice* projects, and more! One day, I was creating literacy books and wanted to learn more about the program. When I found out that the books I was creating were going to a child to help them learn to read, I knew I wanted to do more. So I took the Literacy training and became a tutor! I love the kids I work with and it feels good to know I helping them with such a vital life skill! I continue to volunteer administratively too because I know that every project I work on has a direct impact on the life of someone with Down syndrome! Where else can you say that?!"

It's because of the hundreds of volunteers like Pam who give of their time, that we are able to make a direct impact in our communities as well as continue the mission of spreading awareness and education across the nation!



Most of all, it's about Hannah and the thousands of kids like her, reaching their potential and living life – full of friends, family, responsibility, even bills! It's a full life – the kind we all want. By helping Hannah live the kind of life she dreams of and deserves, the world around her is slowly changing. The kindergarten teacher won't judge future kids in her class. The generation that Hannah grew up being friends with are learning the truth about Down syndrome. The community around Hannah sees her independent lifestyle and changes the way they view Down syndrome. A new appreciation for the reality of what Down syndrome is and what it is not, is born. Everyone has raised expectations for individuals with Down syndrome!

There, before a captivated audience, Lydia read a series of books ending with *The life Cycle of an Insect*. She then took the comprehension test and aced it! "We hoped, we dreamed of her reading someday like her brother James," said mom, Laura. "Our dream came true through the GiGi's reading program. 'Wow,' she would say, 'look at all the word families that I know!' And you could see how proud she was of her academic achievement! She was energized to do more!" The literacy program is for all ages!! All of our books are custom made and are relevant to the individual student. A pre-schooler will start with a custom made family unit, whereas an adult may need a book that is geared toward their place of employment.

Together, with guidance from the Executive Board, we lead the various locations through the in depth process of opening a Playhouse... everything from gathering potential board members to the legal implications of becoming an LLC, training for Literacy and other programs to helping shape the look of their Playhouse! GiGi's Playhouse, Inc. knows that, **with your help**, we can continue opening Playhouses in states around the nation and countries around the world. By helping individuals with Down syndrome reach their potential in their communities, we can increase awareness on an international level and 1 community, 1 state, 1 country at a time, we can change the way the world views Down syndrome!
