GiGi's Playhouse Detroit is changing the way the world views Down syndrome by providing FREE inclusive programming to help our families achieve their Best of All.


Vision:

Program Spotlight: 1:1 Math & Literacy Tutoring

At GiGi's Playhouse Detroit we stress the sense of family to our community and beyond. Through our 1:1 Math and Literacy Tutoring Programs we are able to connect families from all over Metro-Detroit, surrounding counties, and our warm welcome has even reached as far as Ohio! Most of our families take part in math and literacy tutoring in person; but, having a virtual option has allowed us to spread our GiGi's family to places like East Lansing, White Lake, and even to a family who was living in California but preparing to move to our neighborhood join in the fun! Participants can start in our Math and Literacy program as early as 3 years old and can participate long after they've graduated from high school.

We've opened our doors to Oakland and Wayne State Universities and invited medical students to join our GiGi's Family through tutoring and volunteering for other programs. Teachers from local schools sign up to tutor and bring ideas from our curriculum back to their schools. We've had volunteers who retire from their day job and come to tutor and have found a true sense of passion for their "new job". We've also had an individual with Down syndrome go through the tutoring program as a learner then turn around and tutor another student!

Math and Literacy tutoring, like all of our other programs, is completely free. We train all of the tutors and help them design lesson plans unique to each student who signs up. Each session is held for about 45 minutes once a week for a duration of about 12 weeks. We hear all the time how much the student looks forward to seeing his/her tutor and the tutors are always asking to return another session to work with the same student. It is through this bond that we have extended our GiGi's Playhouse Detroit family beyond the four walls of our center and into the surrounding communities!

Meet Sophie! Sophie began attending Kids Club back in January 2021. When she first attended, she didn't want to participate in the program. We did our best to engage her, but she really wanted to march to the beat of her own drum and do what she wanted. When Sophie attended in February, we began using the "first then" promoting positive behaviors tactic. She participated more than she did in January but still was not fully engaged. When Sophie attended Kids Club in March we had our promoting positive behaviors ready for her. When the program lead called her over to join the group Sophie came right over and participated for THE ENTIRE PROGRAM! She happily played the games, did the fine motor tasks (which aren't her favorite) and sat and listened to a story! We are SO proud of Sophie and all her progress we saw her make in just three months!

Meet Sydney! Sydney participates in multiple programs here at the Playhouse some of which include Drama Troupe, Art Explosion and GiGiFIT Adult. She loves being at the Playhouse and anyone who meets her immediately notices her smile that lights up a room and her passionate attitude.

Sydney is incredibly talented and proficient in sign language. When Sydney was asked about her experience with ASL and why she decided to learn how to sign, she said, "I have always been interested in ASL. I had a deaf friend and I took a class at Providence Hospital so I could speak with him. It became something I really enjoyed."

Her goal is to go to college and earn her certificate in sign language so she can teach small kids. However, she isn't waiting for this certificate to start! Sydney is an assistant leader for LMNOP. The LMNOP program teaches basic sign language to kids ages 0-3 and works on communication skills. Sydney has been working with our LMNOP participants and this continues her growth in ASL. We are thrilled to help her pursue her dream and to keep celebrating growth!




