THE BRETT BOYER STORY

Sadie Brett Boyer was born on July 8, 2016 to her loving parents, Ellen and Bo Boyer. It was discovered during pregnancy that Brett would be born with Down syndrome and with Congenital Heart Disease. After becoming sick in the fall of 2016, Brett went on to have her first heart surgery to treat AVSD (Atrioventricular Septal Defect). During surgery, doctors discovered that Brett's heart issues were more complicated then initially thought. She battled through another surgery and several setbacks for 100 days before gaining her angel wings in February 2017. The Brett Boyer Foundation was started a few months later with the mission of changing the outcome for other families.

The Boyer family faced the same fears that so many do when faced with the news that your baby will be born with challenges. What they didn't know was that having Down syndrome would be one of their favorite things about Brett. They consider themselves lucky to have been chosen for the special role of parenting a child with these unique abilities who can lead a long, fullfilling life. However, CHD is a condition that most often requires medical intervention for survival. Our mission is to create the attention, funding, research and advancements that can save the lives of children and to improve the outcome for so many who live with effects of CHD for the entirety of their lives.

We will never stop working toward a different outcome for others with CHD. We will also spread awareness about the tough battles faced in this community as well as celebrating those with Down syndrome who have so much to offer to our world.



The Brett Boyer Foundation is funding research for Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) while raising awareness and supporting the CHD and Down syndrome communities.

CHD currently affects about 40,000 newborns in the United States each year. Of those births, 25% have a critical CHD, which generally requires surgery or other procedures in their first year of life. For those that survive, CHD is a lifelong battle for many as there is no cure.

Community Achievement Award: NorthField Church



This past year we have had the honor and privilege to partner with NorthField Church of Gallatin to open a satellite GiGi's Playhouse location in Sumner County, TN. It has been an amazing partnership, and we are especially thrilled to award NorthField Church our Community Achievement Award.

We were first introduced to NorthField Church by Lauren Springer, the mother of a young boy with Down syndrome, who wanted her son to benefit from the programs and community that GiGi's offers but whose family lived too far north of Nashville to regularly participate. After several introductory discussions, staff at GiGi's Playhouse Nashville worked with Tom Haddon (lead pastor), Bill Jacoby (executive director), and Haley Forrest (children's pastor) to officially kick off a slate of GiGi's programs at NorthField Church this spring.



We have been so grateful to get to know the staff and members of this church over the past year. Not only have they provided us with a location to expand our programs into Sumner County, but they have also provided us with volunteers, program supplies, new ideas, and more!



Thanks to our partnership with NorthField Church, we have served over 15 new participants this spring and gained 21 new volunteers. We can't wait to see our programs at Northfield grow and continue to provide educational and therapeutic programs for individuals with Down syndrome in Sumner County! And we look forward to using this model to expand our services to other areas of Middle Tennessee.



Gloria & Cindy Knoch Award

The Gloria & Cindy Knoch Volunteer Spirit Award honors our founding benefactors, Gloria Knoch, her daughter Cindy, and the entire Knoch family.

Gloria Knoch raised eight children—one of whom was Cindy, born in 1953 with Down syndrome. In 1953, there were very few, if any, resources for children with Down syndrome. Doctors recommended that Gloria institutionalize Cindy. Instead, Gloria and her husband brought Cindy home and into their loving family. Despite the lack of resources for her child, Gloria was a pioneer and began a reading group for children with Down syndrome in her home. The family was not wealthy; despite that, Gloria managed to set aside money for Cindy's future. Sadly, Cindy passed away before Gloria. Upon Gloria's passing, her family wanted to do something that would honor their mother's courage and commitment to supporting and educating her daughter.

The family chose to honor their mother's legacy by giving to the newly opened GiGi's Playhouse Nashville. They recognized that our organization strives to help individuals with Down syndrome achieve to their fullest potential, which is everything that Gloria wanted for Cindy.

The Gloria & Cindy Knoch Volunteer Spirit Award embodies Gloria's giving spirit and her belief that her daughter Cindy could achieve great things if she was given access to the tools and encouragement she needed in order to be successful.

We are pleased to award it to the volunteer of the year for GiGi's Playhouse Nashville, whose giving spirit has greatly impacted our participants.

Volunteer Spotlight



Vicky McKinney first came to GiGi's Playhouse as a mother of a child with Down syndrome, but for the past several years has also been using her training as a behavior support specialist to volunteer and enhance our programming. She has been an incredible resource, helping to provide training for our staff and volunteers across numerous programs and direct behavioral support for individual programs.

For instance, for the past few years, Vicky has helped Program Coordinator Carlie Long lead our volunteer orientations and train new volunteers. During these trainings she provides our volunteers with insight into working with individuals with Down syndrome. She explains why certain behaviors may occur and provides our volunteers with helpful, positive redirection and

reinforcement strategies. As needed, she has also attended numerous programs to model those positive behavioral reinforcements for volunteers to ensure our participants are getting the most out of our programs.

More specifically, Vicky has been integral to the continued success of our music program. As a regular program volunteer, she has helped our program leaders from the Belmont music therapy program navigate behaviors so that our music programs run smoothly and participants are able to receive the most value from the therapeutic and educational components of the program.



Notonly has Vicky made a huge impact on GiGi's Playhouse Nashville but she has also helped other playhouses across our entire network. This past year, she was asked to present her insights on promoting positive behaviors at our national GiGi's Playhouse Conference, with more than 50 playhouses in attendance. We are so proud and lucky to have such amazing volunteers like Vicky.




