
Constance Hunter, AIG, Executive Vice President, Global Head of Strategy & ESG, kicked off the event and welcomed the attendees.




Shawn Dennis' son, Brian, attended the event with his masterpieces proudly on display.

Very honored to say that my son Richard (Rick) Ditolla's artwork was also featured at the showcase.


