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Letter from our Board Co- Presidents

2023 was an unparalleled year of growth and we achieved all that we had promised to our community.

Thanks to the generous donations from individual and corporate donors at our 2022 Annual Gala and numerous other fundraising events throughout the year, as well as grants from foundations and others, we were able to successfully launch our long-awaited Career Development Programs for our adult population.

In April, we hired an experienced Special Educator who worked tirelessly to learn and understand the established curriculum from our National Office, and by June we launched a 4-week pilot program with 4 participants. Afterwards, we took a 2 month break to run our popular summer programs, while our Special Educator continued to fine-tune and enhance the curriculum for our unique participants.

By September, our Career Development Programs, which were oversubscribed, were officially launched with 7 participants and a full 12-week semester. In addition to classroombased instruction, we partnered with several corporations to provide our participants with real-world experience in corporate America. This included Microsoft, Google, Avanade, Accenture, Bullhorn and Nasdaq.

The semester culminated in mid-December with an official graduation, speeches by participants, and certificates of completion. The pride and joy in the room was tangible and there was not a dry eye at the Playhouse. This amazing program was the direct result of the generosity of our community, supporters and parents who all committed to making this dream a reality for our adult population. In fact, these remarkable efforts were recognized at our National Conference with the Generation G award for our "incredible work with adult empowerment and advocacy."





Throughout this initiative, we did not lose focus on our younger population and also developed and enhanced numerous programs to meet the growing needs of the toddlers and young teens within our community. Destination Discovery engaged our participants in games and activities that support the development of fine and gross motor skills, social skills, and language and communication skills through peer-to-peer interaction in a casual and fun setting. We introduced additional Music, Dance and Puppetry programs and launched the new "Kids Club" program.

We continued to support parents throughout the year, with educational seminars on topics including guardianship, supported decision making, and money management, as well as with parent support groups.

As you can see from this annual report, through our social media, through our annual fashion show, through our monthly

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participant blogs, our community has no limits, our participants exceed expectations, and our supporters want to see us succeed as much as our families do. We are reaching new heights with each passing year, with each new program, with each new family, with each new volunteer.

GiGi's NYC is governed by a Board of Directors, an Associate Board and a Youth Board and is managed by two amazing fulltime staff. But in reality, it's your Playhouse, it's our Playhouse. We are all in this together, so let's continue to come together and keep reaching for the stars!

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Our Story

Overview

GiGi's Playhouse NYC is the only organization in New York City solely dedicated to the development of individuals with Down syndrome of all ages, from birth through adulthood, and at every phase of life. We provide therapeutic, educational, social, and creative arts programs and events year-round, at no cost to participants or their families.

GiGi's NYC serves over 1,000 people with Down syndrome and their families, representing almost 10% of the NYC Down syndrome population.

We empower our diverse participants to be included in the greater community, to be their whole selves as they truly belong, and to make the world a better place.

We offer a supportive and nurturing environment that enables those with Down syndrome, their families and even expecting parents, to connect and learn from one another to navigate the world they share.



GiGi's NYC is consistently at the forefront of innovation, as evidenced by our migration to a hybrid model. We design and deliver online programs to complement our face-to-face programs for our growing community, all while being completely funded by our generous donors.

Vision

Our vision is to see a world where individuals with Down syndrome have a voice, are accepted and embraced in their families, schools and communities, and to help improve the world and make it a better place to live, work and prosper.

Mission

Our mission is to improve the lives of all people with Down syndrome, from birth through adulthood, by providing them with the resources they need to apply to life's challenges and achieve. 

Recurring Programs



Best Buddies Friendship Programs

In partnership with Best Buddies, we relaunched their Friendship Program with The Dalton School and Columbia University. Through group meetings, participants form meaningful connections with their "buddies" and peers, gain self-confidence and selfesteem, and share interests, experiences and activities. Recommended for ages 14 and older.

Community Chorus

We re-launched our Community Chorus Program, where participants rehearsed motivational and empowering songs in preparation for their performance at our annual Gala. We even added in some choreography this year! Recommended for ages 13 and older.

Dance

This program introduces basic dance styles, techniques, and movements while improving gross motor skills, increasing mental and muscle memory and increasing cardiovascular conditioning, strength, flexibility and coordination. Recommended for ages 13 and older.

Family Speaker - TableTalk

This program provides a safe space where the GiGi's NYC community can share their experiences, exchange resources, network, build connections, and so much more. Guest speakers sometimes join the group to present on varying topics based on the needs of our community. Recommended for parents, caregivers, siblings, and friends who have a loved one with Down syndrome.

Fantastic Friends - Bowling Buddies

This community favorite program offers a social gathering for our participants that supports the development of motor skills and social skills in a casual and fun setting. Recommended for ages 18 and older.

Fantastic Friends - Night Out

In partnership with New York Cares, we offer an engaging social night for adults with Down syndrome. There is a different theme with varying activities each month, including karaoke, dance parties, friendsgiving and more! This program allows our participants the opportunity to hone their social skills and build friendships with their same-age peers. Recommended for ages 18 and older.

Friends, Fun & Fitness

Our friends get together for physical activity and a healthy snack! Recommended for ages 13 and older.

GiGi's Kitchen

Under the guidance of a program leader, participants prepare and cook healthy recipes. Participants are taught about kitchen safety, food preparation, health and wellness. The semester culminates with the participants' preparing and enjoying a three-course meal together. Recommended for ages 16 and older.



Gratitude Art Committee

Participants use their talent to create oneof-a-kind art for our supporters! They gain hands-on experience with multiple art media while expressing themselves, building confidence and socializing with peers. Société Générale features a permanent installation of Gratitude Art in their New York City office. Recommended for ages 18 and older.

Leaders in Communication

In partnership with the New York University Speech-Language-Hearing Clinic, our participants work with graduate school speech-language pathology clinicians in a dynamic series of sessions focused on social communication skills, interview skills, empowerment, and advocacy. Recommended for ages 13 and older.

LitLab

This program connects participants with tutors to engage in arts-inspired learning and to create presentations on various engaging topics. We focus on reading, public speaking, PowerPoint, and social skills, as we dive into fun research projects based on a mutual appreciation of music, art, dance, reading, cooking, and more. Recommended for ages 13 and older.

LMNOP

In partnership with the staff and students of Hunter College, School of Education, we offer Language Music N' Our Peeps (LMNOP), an interactive and engaging program designed to guide parents and young children through learning basic sign language and other forms of communication while using music and language-based activities. Recommended for ages pre-natal to 36 months.

One-to-One Literacy Tutoring

This program uses a methodology with documented success based on research by professionals in the field. Our goal is to foster a love for reading and provide an opportunity to develop and master skills. Trained tutors work at the level of each student, continually challenging and encouraging them to reach their highest potential. Recommended for ages 3 and older.

One-to-One Math Tutoring

Building math skills for individuals with Down syndrome increases independence at school, in the community, and in the work place.
The aim of this program is to help promote a positive experience of learning mathematics with a sound foundation of basic number understanding. Recommended for ages 3 and older.

One-to-One Speech

In partnership with the New York University Speech-Language-Hearing Clinic, participants have the opportunity to receive screenings, evaluations, and intervention services in the areas of speech, language, hearing, voice, and stuttering on an individual basis. Recommended for all ages.

Yoga

Yoga gives our particpants a practice and routine that integrates physical, mental, and emotional development. This program helps participants develop more personal awareness and learn specific strategies to maintain focus and manage their emotions and impulses. Recommended for ages 5 and older.



Summer Programs

Kids Club

This program encompasses a broad range of activities that facilitate sensory exploration, gross and motor development, and language skills, while leveraging parent and caregiver involvement at the Playhouse and within NYC. Recommended for ages 8 to 12.

Teen Tastic

This program allows our participants to explore their independence while learning life skills, developing social skills and relationships, and experiencing the culture and arts of New York City. Recommended for ages 13 to 17.

Fantastic Friends

Participants have the opportunity to continue developing meaningful life skills through shared experiences and various learning opportunities. Building friendships and reinforcing skills such as self-confidence, healthy lifestyles, money management, and more are all part of the curriculum. Recommended for ages 18 and older.



New Programs

Art Explosion - Puppetry

Under the guidance of classically trained, multi-disciplined puppeteer Daniel Patrick Fay, participants create their very own puppets, with the session culminating in a puppet show starring their unique puppet creations! Recommended for ages 18 and older.

Destination Discovery

Participants engage in games and activities that support the development of fine and gross motor skills, social skills, language and communication skills through peer to peer interaction in a casual and fun setting. Recommended for ages 13 and older.

Drama Troupe - Filmmaking

This program aims to teach skills in script writing, acting, directing, and set/costume design. It was the brainchild of our amazing participants, and GiGi's NYC was thrilled to bring it to life with them! Recommended for ages 18 and older.

GiGi Prep

This program is for adults with Down syndrome who would like to continue on the career development path. GiGi Prep places emphasis on building communication skills, money management, customer service skills, team building and wellness. Recommended for ages 18 and older.

Kids Club

This program supports the development of social skills and language through peer-topeer interaction in a casual and fun setting. This program also supports gross motor skills, fine motor skills, and self-help skills through active games and various activities. Recommended for ages 8 to 12.





Music

This program allows our participants to tap into their inner rock star and let their voices shine while singing a variety of fun and empowering songs! Recommended for ages 13 and older.

Open Play

Promotes positive beginnings for new families, creates awareness opportunities for peers and friends while allowing families to network and support one another. Come ready for fun and a crazy good time! Recommended for ages 8 to 12.



Career **Development Programs**

Thanks to the incredible generosity of The RBC Foundation USA and our amazing donors, GiGi's NYC was able to launch our Career **Development Programs. Parents and care** givers expressed the dire need for these programs, as they are often faced with tough decisions regarding the best route for the future of their loved ones, as more than 50% of our participants were over the age of 18. Our ability to provide our community with the skills necessary to enter the workforce has been an absolute honor. We were so happy to see these programs come to life, and our participants wouldn't have had the opportunity to take their next steps toward independence without generous donations.

The Career Development Programs are comprised of three tiers: GiGi Prep, GiGi University, and GiGi Professional. These progressive learning programs are designed to help adults with Down syndrome to gain meaningful job-related skills and experience, with the goal of employment or volunteering within the community. The cost for one participant to complete all three semesters is \$10,000, which includes the expense of a special educator, classroom space, administrative support, as well as all the necessary supplies.

In the fall of 2023, we launched our very first semester of GiGi Prep with seven eager young adult students.



The GiGi Prep curriculum focuses on communication, math (money management/ financial literacy), goal setting, nutrition/ healthy eating, fitness, and team building. Within the curriculum, the students created vision boards, prepared new healthy recipes each week, and practiced formal communication skills. We openly discussed their career goals and dream jobs. Our GiGi Prep class was filled with aspiring bakers, party planners, paramedics, writers, fashion stylists, photographers, and music producers. Our sstudents were motivated and inspired, and we were so happy to be able to learn from each of them week after week.

We also participated in several meaningful experiences with new and existing community partners during GiGi Prep. We kicked off our experiences with a trip to the Microsoft offices in Times Square, where our participants sat on a panel with executives from Microsoft, Avanade, Accenture, and Nasdag and asked and answered questions related to career readiness. Our participants gained invaluable experience-what an incredible way to start our semester!

Our next community event was held remotely with Bullhorn, a virtual recruitment company. Our students practiced their formal communication skills during a group discussion about careers, time management skills, and

interviewing, followed by individual mockinterviews with members of the Bullhorn team from all around the world. The unique experience left an impact on each of us!

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
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
