GiGi's Playhouse Down Syndrome Achievement Centers across North America provide FREE progressive, purposeful programs to educate and inspire individuals of all ages with Down syndrome. GiGi's provides a tremendous breadth and depth of educational, therapeutic, and social/ life skills programs from prenatal through adulthood.



Currently there are 46 playhouses and another 200 locations in development across North America, including Mexico. **Volunteers are our lifeblood**; nationally, on average, for each staff member, there are 100 volunteers.

GiGi's Playhouse Twin Cities opened its doors in 2013. Our 10,000-square-foot space is equipped with one-on-one tutoring rooms, a full teaching kitchen, computer training room, other classrooms, a theatrical stage, and a full gym.

Thanks in no small part to the thousands of financial supporters and our amazing, energetic, compassionate, committed volunteers who come through our doors each year, we have grown to become one of the largest GiGi's Playhouse Down Syndrome Achievement Centers in all of North America. It has truly been a remarkable, joyous, hopeful and determined journey so far.

Nothing is more inspiring to us than watching our participants run into our Playhouse with sheer joy and excitement, ready to build their confidence and have fun no matter their age. This year, we have grown to 25 educational, therapeutic and life skill programs offered close to 100 times annually. We have had close to 1,000 participant check-ins in across our three locations: Our 10,000 square foot Achievement Center in St. Louis Park along with our two new satellite locations in the South Metro and Hudson, Wisconsin.

Our focus continues to be on building awareness of GiGi's Playhouse so that we can reach and positively inspire all of the estimated 4,000 individuals with Down syndrome across our metro area. As we move forward this year, our priorities include 1) Increasing community awareness of our FREE-FOR-PARTICIPANTS progressive, purposeful programming 2) Enhancing outreach efforts, particularly to underrepresented communities 3) Sustaining and building satellite locations for long term success, and 4) Excelling in every aspect of our operations so that we continue to lead the way for centers across the entire network.

We have so much to celebrate and so many opportunities in front of us! Let's continue our work together so we can continue to see the power of "GiGi's magic" unlock the full potential of individuals with Down syndrome in the Twin Cities area!



2018-2019 Major Accomplishments

EPIC Expansion (Empowerment, Participation, Independence and Community Involvement)

GiGi's Playhouse Twin Cities expanded EPIC programming to further build

social, communication, fitness and independent living skills to empower and build confidence for our adult participants. We increased participation by almost 5 times from the previous year to more than 60 adults. In all, each participant received a total of 36 hours of hands-on instruction, plus in-home assignments including presentations, fitness training and meal planning and preparation.



With our main location in Saint Louis Park, GiGi's Playhouse Twin Cities is the first Metro in North America to open two satellite locations simultaneously in an effort to solve geographic distance problems and increase access to programming. Both locations (Hudson, WI, and South

Metro in Apple Valley, MN) are now offering a variety of programming on a weekly and monthly basis. Our long term goal is to serve the Twin Cities metro to maximize our impact.

Activation to reach a broader, more diverse community

Currently, both Hispanic and Somali families with individuals with Down syndrome are underserved. We recognized the importance of reaching out to both communities to offer our programs and expand our community to better serve these families. We now have two new parent groups, each meeting at GiGi's Playhouse. Both groups will continue meeting on a regular basis. Our next step is to expand, adopt, and more deeply deliver programming options for their children.

A Mother's Love for her Son and her Community

When Sahra brought home Mustaf from the hospital in 2003, she didn't have much information about Down syndrome — nor was there anyone she knew of that could answer her questions about Down syndrome in the Somali language. With no referrals to help, Sahra started doing her own research about Down syndrome and discovered that people with Down syndrome develop and learn in different ways compared to their typically-developing peers.

She reached out to parents with children with Down syndrome at Mustaf's school and thankfully discovered GiGi's Playhouse Twin Cities. When Sahra brought Mustaf to GiGi's, she felt a sigh of relief and pure joy. She immediately enrolled him in literacy and math tutoring, social skills groups, Team G Basketball and more recently, Everyone Can Dance. She saw Mustaf thriving and gaining confidence through his GiGi's experience.

Sahra shared that growing up in Somalia, people with Down syndrome exist, but not out in public – from birth, people with Down syndrome are immediately sent off to a hospital for the rest of their lives. In 2018, Sahra was inspired to change this misperception in her adopted community. Together with GiGi's Playhouse and The Down Syndrome Association of Minnesota, a Somali Parent Group was created.

For the last year, GiGi's Playhouse has become a home away from home, giving Somali parents a chance to network with each other and begin to believe their children with Down syndrome all have so much potential. This has happily led to more Somali families becoming involved with GiGi's Playhouse Twin Cities' progressive, and purposeful, programming. -Staff interview with Sahra, Mustaf's Mom

Launch the Empowerment and Independence Center of Excellence

The NEW Center of Excellence will take our successful EPIC program to the next level to help empower adults age 18+ with a progressive, three-companion program curriculum including: 1) Nutritional Meal Budgeting & Preparation 2) Fitness & Living Healthy 3) Social Skills & Computer Social Media Use.

Diversity Outreach & Programming

In the coming year, GiGi's Playhouse Twin Cities will adapt and expand programing for both the Somali and Hispanic communities. The goal is to better serve and positively infuse our progressive and purposeful programming into both communities.

Optimize Satellite Location Growth and Sustainability

Our priority in the upcoming year is to sustain growth and operations while upholding GiGi's Mission and Standards in both satellites. Our focus for each location will be 1) building breadth and depth of volunteers, 2) engagement and support of local communities, and 3) expand programming appropriately to help ensure long-term success.

Maximizing the Playhouse Experience

Our goal is to continue to enhance and expand our participants' experience and to provide them with the most meaningful upgrades they want/need to thrive throughout their life.

• Cardio Club -- Everyone deserves a healthy heart!

One universal characteristic of a Down syndrome diagnosis is low muscle tone, which can often include the heart. The vision for GiGi's Cardio Club is to create a semi-enclosed, safe space in our Gym with stationary bikes and rowing machines.

• Teen Enrichment ZONE – Teens and Young Adults like their own space to hang out!

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
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
